BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Silkworm Industry Protection (Amendment) Law, 1925, and shall be read as one with the Silkworm Industry Protection Law, 1922, and the said Law and this Law may together be cited as the Silkworm Industry Protection Laws, 1922 and 1925. Short title.

2. It shall not be lawful for any company, corporation, persons or person whatsoever to instal, erect, establish, maintain or use in the Island of Cyprus any filature for the manufacture of silk without having previously obtained from the High Commissioner a license in that behalf to be granted on such terms and conditions as the High Commissioner may prescribe. No filature to be established without the license of the High Commissioner.

Provided always that this Law shall not apply to any hand-reeling apparatus in common use in Cyprus.

This Law was published in the Cyprus Gazette No. 1678 of the 20th February, 1925.
