2. The Principal Law, section 4, shall be amended by the deletion of the words "no step shall be taken to include or remove any such minister" and the substitution therefor of the following words :

"no step shall be taken to remove any such minister and a minister for whose inclusion in the register a requisition as aforesaid has been made shall be provisionally registered."

3. The Principal Law, section 19, is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :

19. Where a marriage is celebrated by a registered minister of persons who are not members of the same Church, the parties thereto shall within fifteen days of such celebration of marriage appear before a marriage officer and effect registration thereof. Any person who, being a party to such marriage, fails without reasonable excuse to register a marriage within the period aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, provided always that the marriage officer shall proceed to register such marriage in accordance with the Law.

Preamble

WHEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1926, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

BE it therefore enacted :—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, 1926.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated to the service of the King or which may be hereafter lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1926, any sum not exceeding the sum of Four Hundred and Seventy-Six Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Four Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.

3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each head in the Schedule hereto may be issued and spent in respect of the Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein ; provided that the total sum spent on Personal Emoluments during the year, appropriated under this Law, shall not exceed the sum of Two Hundred and Thirty-Six Thousand Three Hundred and One Pounds.
