WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for certain expenses of the Government of Cyprus, which are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

BE it therefore enacted :--

1. This Law may be cited as the Surplus Balance short title. Appropriation Law, 1926.

2. There shall be issued and applied during the period of Appropriatwelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, ton of for 1926, to the services enumerated hereunder an additional twelve sum not exceeding the sum of fifty-one thousand pounds ending 31st for defraying the services herein declared. A.D. 1926. To AMEND THE LAW REGULATING PENSIONS, GRATUITIES, 2 of 1926. AND OTHER ALLOWANCES TO BE GRANTED IN RESPECT OF OFFICES HELD IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE OF CYPRUS.

BE it enacted :--

Short title.

Pension of officers discharged on the grounds of inefficiency. 1. This Law may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1926, and shall be read as one with the Pensions Law, 1905, and the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1924, and these Laws and this Law may together be cited as the Pensions Laws, 1905 to 1926.

2. Where an officer is removed from his office on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties thereof, and a pension, gratuity, or other allowance cannot otherwise be granted to him under the provisions of the Pensions Laws, 1905 to 1926, the Governor-in-Council, with the approval of the Secretary of State, may if he considers it justifiable, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, grant such a pension, gratuity, or other allowance as he thinks just and proper, but in no case exceeding in amount that for which the officer would be qualified if he were suffering from some infirmity of mind or body likely to be permanent.
