TO AMEND THE LAW ENABLING COMMISSIONERS OF
DISTRICTS TO COMPOUND CERTAIN OFFENCES.

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Compounding of Offences (Amendment) Law, 1926, and shall be read as one with the Compounding of Offences Law, 1901, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Compounding of Offences Laws, 1901 and 1926.

2. The Principal Law, section 2 (b), is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "section 37 of the Field Watchmen Law, 1896" and the substitution therefor of the words "section 83 of the Police Law, 1878."

TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF TRAFFIC ON
PUBLIC OCCASIONS.

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Control of Traffic Law, 1926.

Officer in

2. The Officer in Charge of Police in any district may from time to time make orders for the route to be observed by all carts, carriages, bicycles, motor cars, motor cycles, and horses and for preventing the obstruction of the streets in such district whether such streets are situate within or without the limits of a Municipal area and in any case when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, and may also give directions for keeping order and preventing any obstruction of the streets in the neighbourhood of theatres and other places of public resort.

3. Any person committing a wilful breach of any order made under the provisions of this Law shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.
