shot gun) for my own use during my visit to Cyprus only, and that it is my intention to export the motor car (or motor cycle or shot gun) within a period of four months from the date of importation, and that I will not sell the motor car (or motor cycle or shot gun) without first informing the Chief Collector of Customs and without paying the full amount of import duty prescribed by Law, less the sum deposited by me on the arrival in Cyprus of the motor car (or motor cycle or shot gun).

## TO FACILITATE THE GRANTING OF LICENSES TO IMPORT FIREARMS.

Short title.

Amendment of Law 24 of 1879, sec. 30 (2), as amended by Law 9 of 1927, sec. 2 (1). 1. This Law may be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment, No. 2) Law, 1927, and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise Regulation Law, 1879, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1924, and the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1927, and the Principal Law and the said Laws and this Law may together be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulation Laws, 1879 to 1927.

2. The Principal Law, section 30 (2), as amended by the Customs and Excise Regulation (Amendment) Law, 1927, section 2 (1), is hereby further amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :—

Provided that the Chief Collector of Customs or any Officer of Customs or Excise empowered by him to act on his behalf may, without first obtaining the opinion of the Commissioner of the District, grant a special license to import firearms to any individual who is personally known to the said Chief Collector of Customs or to the Officer of Customs or Excise empowered by him to act on his behalf and to any tourist or visitor subject to such terms and conditions as the Chief Collector of Customs or the Officer of Customs or Excise empowered by him to act on his behalf shall think fit to impose.
