BE it enacted:

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Village Roads (Amendment) Law, 1928, and shall be read as one with the Village Roads Law, 1900, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Village Roads Laws, 1900 and 1928.

Amendment of Law 6 of 1900, sec. 12

2. The Principal Law, section 12 (1), is hereby amended by the deletion in lines 1, 2 and 3 of the words "Where any road, street or alley in any village requires to be widened, straightened, or improved, and it is thought necessary to acquire any property for this purpose," and the substitution therefor of the words "Where it is thought necessary to acquire any property in any village for any of the following purposes:

(a) The construction of any road, street or alley;

(b) The opening, widening, straightening, or improving of any existing road, street or alley:

(c) Any work for the improvement or sanitation of the village,".
