(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such Rules may-

(a) Prescribe the mode of taking the periodical census referred to in section 4 of this Law:

(b) Provide for the imposition on offenders against any Rules made under this Law of penalties not exceeding one pound for each offence.

HEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such Preamble. expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1929, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

BE it therefore enacted :--

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, 1929. Short title.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated Appropriato the service of the King or which may be hereafter law- tion of £600,254. fully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1929, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, any sum not exceeding the sum of Six Hundred Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty-four Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.

Limitation of the sum to be spent on Personal Emoluments. 3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each head in the Schedule hereto may be issued and spent in respect of the Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein; provided that the total sum spent on Personal Emoluments during the year, appropriated under this Law, shall not exceed the sum of Two Hundred and Sixtytwo Thousand Five Hundred and Seventy-three Pounds.
