

Deductions made under this Law not to affect pension or gratuity.

5. No deduction made under this Law shall affect the computation or amount of any pension or gratuity granted upon final retirement to any Government servant or teacher under any Law or regulation relating to pensions or gratuities.

Time of deducting temporary levy, etc.

6. Any temporary levy under this Law shall be deducted by the Treasurer at the time of payment of salary and shall be paid into the General Revenue of Cyprus.

Validation of present temporary levy.

7. All deductions made from salaries of Government servants and teachers by way of temporary levy since the 1st day of October, 1931, are hereby validated.

Duration of Law.

8. This Law shall remain in force until the 31st day of December, 1933, and shall then expire:

Provided that the Governor in Council may with the approval of the Secretary of State by Order declare that this Law shall remain in force until a date to be fixed in such Order.

A LAW TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO CO-OPERATIVE CREDIT SOCIETIES.

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Co-operative Credit Societies (Amendment) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Co-operative Credit Societies Laws, 1914 to 1929, (hereinafter called the "Principal Law").

New section substituted for section 19 of the Principal Law.

2. The following section shall be substituted for section 19 of the Principal Law (as set out in section 2 of the Co-operative Credit Societies (Amendment) Law, 1928):—

"Audit.

19.—(1) The Registrar shall audit or cause to be audited by some person authorized by him by general or special order in writing in this behalf the accounts of every registered society once at least in every year.

(2) The audit under sub-section (1) shall include an examination of overdue debts, if any, and a valuation of the assets and liabilities of the society.

(3) The Registrar or any person authorized by general or special order in writing in this behalf by the Registrar shall at all times have access to all the books, accounts, papers, cash and securities of a society, and every officer of the society shall furnish such information in regard to the transactions and working of the society as the person making such inspection may require.

(4) Subject to the general directions and instructions of the Registrar, the Commissioner of the District in which the society is carrying on business shall be deemed to be a person authorized within the meaning of the preceding sub-section."

A LAW TO AMEND THE FOREIGN TRIBUNAL CITATION LAW, 1912.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Foreign Tribunal Citation (Amendment) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Foreign Tribunal Citation Law, 1912, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"). Short title.

2. The Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 3 of the following section:— New section 3A inserted in the Principal Law.

"Procedure to be adopted where a Convention is in force.

3A. Where in any civil or commercial matter pending before a Court or Tribunal in any foreign country with which a Convention on that behalf has been or shall be made and applied to Cyprus a Request for service of any document on a person in Cyprus is received by the Chief Registrar of the Supreme Court from the Consular or other authority of such country the following procedure shall, subject to any special provisions contained in the Convention, be adopted:—
