A LAW TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF HORNS AND OTHER A.D. 1933 NOISY APPLIANCES ON CERTAIN VEHICLES. 6 of 1933

BE it enacted :--

1. This Law may be cited as the Bulb Horns and short title. Whistles Prohibition Law, 1933.

2. No person riding, driving or in charge of any bicycle Prohibition or any vehicle other than a motor car or motor cycle of the use of horns, etc., shall carry thereon or sound any bulb horn, whistle, or on bicycles any other appliance adapted for the making of an audible and other vehicles. sound except only a bell.

3. No person shall use, possess or sell a bicycle fitted Prohibition with a bell which is operated by means of contact direct of use of certain bells or indirect with either of the wheels of the bicycle or on bicycles. which can be operated so as to ring continuously without movement of the fingers.

4. Any person acting in contravention of this Law shall Penalty. be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten shillings and the appliance in respect of which the offence has been committed shall be forfeited.

This Law came into operation on 27th January, 1933.

1. This Law may be cited as the Imports Municipal Toll Short title.
