BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Advocates (Amendment) Law, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Advocates Laws, 1933, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Advocates Laws, 1933 to 1934.

2. Section 6 of the Principal Law is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By the insertion in paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) thereof immediately after the words “such examination” of the words “if any”.

(b) By the deletion of sub-section (4) and by the substitution therefor of the following sub-section:—

“(4) Every candidate for an examination under this section shall pay the following fees into the Public Treasury:—

(a) For an examination under paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) a fee not exceeding two pounds, as the Chief Justice may direct.

(b) For an examination under paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) a fee of five pounds.”

*This Law came into operation on 9th February, 1934.*
