A.D. 1934. A LAW TO ABOLISH THE TAX ON SHEEP AND PIGS.

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Sheep and Pigs Tax Abolition Law, 1934.

Sheep and pigs taxes abolished.

2. From and after the first day of January one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four no enumeration of sheep or pigs for the purpose of taxation shall be made and no tax shall be levied or paid thereon.

Repeal and saving.

3. The enactments set out in the Schedule to this Law are hereby repealed to the extent specified in the second column of that Schedule:

Provided that all taxes on sheep or pigs payable under any enactment hereby repealed which are still due and unpaid on the coming into operation of this Law, shall be collected and paid as if this Law had not been enacted.

SCHEDULE.

Enactments repealed.

Title	Extent of repeal
Ottoman Regulations of 13 Jemazi-ul-Akhir, 1277.	In so far as they relate to the taxation of pigs.
Ottoman Regulations of 2 Jemazi-ul-Evvel, 1287.	In so far as they relate to the taxation of pigs.
Ottoman Regulations of 30 Zilkade, 1287.	In so far as they relate to the taxation of sheep.
The Goats Law, 1888, (10 of 1888).	Section 2 in so far as it relates to sheep.
The Elementary Education Law, 1933, (18 of 1933).	Sections 66, 68 and 69, in so far as they relate to sheep and pigs.

This Law came into operation on 9th February, 1934.
