A.D. 1935. A LAW TO AMEND THE WINES AND SPIRITS (SALE TO
18 of 1935. SOLDIERS AND SAILORS) LAW, 1879.

BE it enacted :—

Short title. 1. This Law may be cited as the Wines and Spirits
7 of 1879. (Sale to Soldiers and Sailors) (Amendment) Law, 1935,
and shall be read as one with the Wines and Spirits (Sale
to Soldiers and Sailors) Law, 1879, (hereinafter called
“the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this
Law may together be cited as the Wines and Spirits (Sale
to Soldiers and Sailors) Laws, 1879 and 1935.

Repeal of
section 1 of
Law 7 of
1879 and
substitution

2. Section 1 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed
and the following substituted therefor :—

“Restriction
upon the
supply of
spirits to
soldiers,
sailors and
airmen in
uniform.

1.—(1) No person shall supply any soldier,
sailor or airman in uniform with any spirits
without the permission in writing of the
officer commanding His Majesty's Military,
Naval or Air Forces in the Colony, as the
case may be.

(2) Any person who acts in contravention
of sub-section (1) of this section shall be guilty
of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment
not exceeding one month or to a fine not
exceeding five pounds or to both.”

This Law came into operation on 12th July, 1935.
