A LAW FURTHER TO AMEND THE LICENSING LAW, 1889.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Licensing (Amendment) Law, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1934, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Licensing Laws, 1889 to 1936.

2. Section 21 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

"Hours of
closing.

21.—(1) All premises on which intoxicating liquors are sold by retail shall be closed every night at such hour and shall remain closed until such hour as the Governor may by Order direct.

(2) In any Order made under sub-section (1), the Governor may authorize the Commissioner to extend, by special permit under his hand, the time during which any premises on which intoxicating liquors are sold by retail may remain open on any night specified in such special permit upon payment of such fee, not exceeding two shillings for every hour, as may be prescribed by the Order.

(3) Where a special permit has been granted by the Commissioner under sub-section (2), notwithstanding anything in this Law contained it shall be lawful for the licensed person during the currency of his licence to sell on any night specified in such special permit intoxicating liquors by retail on the licensed premises during the extended time specified therein."

This Law came into operation on 9th October, 1936.
