THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 12 OF 1939.

A LAW TO AMEND THE MEDICAL REGISTRATION LAW, 1936.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Medical Registration (Amendment) Law, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Medical Registration Law, 1936, (hereinafter called “ the Principal Law ”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Medical Registration Laws, 1936 and 1939.

2. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Law immediately after section 16 thereof :—

Insertion of new section 16A in Law 22 of 1936.

“ Power to Governor to order that name of medical practitioner be removed from the Register.

16A.—(1) Where any medical practitioner has been convicted of an offence under Chapter VII or VIII of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1937, the Governor may by order direct the Registrar to remove from the Register the name of such medical practitioner, and the Registrar shall comply with such order.

The Cyprus Criminal Code Order in Council, 1928.

(2) The Governor may at any time revoke any order made under sub-section (1).

(3) Every order and every revocation of an order made under this section shall be notified to the Registrar.

(4) Where an order has been revoked under sub-section (2), the Registrar shall, on the payment of such fee, not exceeding the registration fee, as the Medical Council may from time to time fix, restore to the Register the name of the medical practitioner to whom such revocation relates.”

Repeal of section 17 of Law 22 of 1936 and substitution of new section.

3. Section 17 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor :—

“ Removal of name of medical practitioner from the Register.

17.—(1) The Registrar shall remove from the Register the name of any medical practitioner—

- (a) who is deceased ;
- (b) who has been registered through error as to his qualifications for registration ;
- (c) against whom an order that his name be erased from the Register has been made by the Medical Council under section 14 and the order has not been reversed on appeal ;
- (d) who has been deprived of the qualifications under which he is registered by the body which granted them.

(2) The Medical Council may, if it think fit, at any time after the expiration of five years from the date on which the name of a medical practitioner has been erased from the Register under paragraph (c) of sub-section (1), direct the Registrar to restore to the Register the name of such medical practitioner, and upon such direction and on the payment of such fee, not exceeding the registration fee, as the Medical Council may from time to time fix, the Registrar shall restore to the Register the name of such medical practitioner.”
