BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

Short title.

19 of 1936 29 of 1937 19 of 1938 1. This Law may be cited as the Public Health (Villages) Amendment Law, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1938, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1939.

Insertion of new section 9A in the Principal Law. 2. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Law immediately after section 9 thereof:—

"Power to Village Health Commission to borrow money.

9A. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Law, the Village Health Commission may borrow, with the consent and under the authority of an Order of the Governor in Council and subject to the terms and conditions that may be imposed by such Order, money from the Loan Commissioners or from any other person for carrying out any work or measure which the Village Health Commission may, in the performance of any of its duties or in the exercise of any of its powers under the provisions of this Law, carry out, and for the purpose of securing the payment of the principal and interest of any such loan may mortgage any property, fees, charges or rates to the lender.'
