A LAW TO AMEND THE IMMOVABLE PROPERTY
(RESTRICTION AND POSTPONEMENT OF SALES)
LAWS, 1935 TO 1939.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Immovable Property (Restriction and Postponement of Sales) (Amendment No. 2) Law, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Immovable Property (Restriction and Postponement of Sales) Laws, 1935 to 1939, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Immovable Property (Restriction and Postponement of Sales) Laws, 1935 to (No. 2) 1939.

2. Paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

3. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Law immediately after section 7 thereof:—

7A.—(1) Where at any time after the 20th day of December, 1939, the Principal Land Registry Officer shall, pursuant to section 7, defer the fixing of or postpone any sale of immovable property, the registration of any judgment affecting such property subsisting on the date of the deferment or postponement made as aforesaid, shall, notwithstanding anything contained in the Civil Procedure Laws, 1885 to 1939, continue in force for a period of one year reckoned from the date upon which such registration would have expired but for the provisions of this sub-section.

(2) Where at an auction of immovable property held at any time after the 20th day of December, 1939, any such property remains unsold by reason of the reserved price not having been bid at such auction, the registration of any judgment affecting such property subsisting on the date of such auction, shall, notwithstanding anything in the Civil Procedure Laws, 1885 to 1939, continue in force for a period of one year reckoned from the date upon which such registration would have expired but for the provisions of this sub-section."
