THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 13 OF 1941.

**A LAW TO AMEND THE CYPRUS VOLUNTEER
FORCE LAW, 1940.**

Governor.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Cyprus Volunteer Short title.
Force (Amendment) Law, 1941, and shall be read as one
with the Cyprus Volunteer Force Law, 1940, (hereinafter 16 of 1940
referred to as “the principal Law”), and the principal
Law and this Law may together be cited as the Cyprus
Volunteer Force Laws, 1940 and 1941.

Insertion of new section 11A in the principal Law.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion after section 11 of the following section:—

“Calling out and mobilization of the Force.

11A. The Governor may, by Proclamation, call out and mobilize the Force or any part thereof for actual service whenever it appears advisable to do so by reason of the existence of a state of war or of the apprehension of war or by reason of any internal emergency threatening the security of life or property.”

Repeal of section 18 of the principal Law and substitution of new section.

3. Section 18 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

“Relief for widows and families of members of the Force killed during service.

18. The widow or family of any officer or other rank who—

(a) is killed while serving with the Force;

(b) dies of wounds received while serving with the Force;

(c) dies from disease or illness directly attributable to his service with the Force;

shall receive such pension or gratuity as may be determined by the Governor in Council, chargeable upon the Revenue of the Colony.”

Repeal of section 21 of the principal Law and substitution of new section.

4. Section 21 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

“Limitation of action.

21. Every civil action against, and every criminal prosecution of, any person in respect of anything done in pursuance or in contravention of this Law shall be commenced within six months after the cause of the proceedings has arisen.”

Date of commencement.

5. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 14th day of June, 1940.
