**A LAW TO AMEND THE RURAL CONSTABLES  
LAWS, 1932 TO 1937.**

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Rural Constables (Amendment) Law, 1942, and shall be read as one with the Rural Constables Laws, 1932 to 1937, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Rural Constables Laws, 1932 to 1942.

2. Section 5 of the principal Law is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the deletion from sub-section (1) of the words "on a day to be appointed by the Mukhtar and not later than the 7th day of December in every two years" and the substitution therefor of the words "between the 1st day of November and the 15th day of December in every two years";

(b) by the deletion of sub-section (2) and the substitution therefor of the following sub-section :—

“(2) The monthly salary of every rural constable or temporary rural constable shall not be less than three pounds and, in case such rural constable or temporary rural constable is required to keep a horse, his monthly salary shall not be less than three pounds and ten shillings.”

Salaries of rural constables.

3. Notwithstanding anything in the principal Law contained, the Village Commission of every village and the Group Commission of every group shall, on a day to be appointed by the Mukhtar and not later than the 31st day of May, 1942, hold a meeting of their members at which they shall, by resolution of the majority of the members present, decide the amount of the monthly salary to be paid to every rural constable or temporary rural constable for the period 1st day of July, 1942, to the 31st day of December, 1942.

Assessment, collection and recovery.

4.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the principal Law contained, the Mukhtar in conjunction with the Village Commission or Group Commission shall, before the 31st day of May, 1942, assess any additional amount required by reason of the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 5 of the principal Law, as amended by this Law, upon all occupiers of the village or group and shall make a list (hereinafter referred to as “the assessment list”) containing the name and occupation of every occupier and the amount assessed upon each and shall make such number of copies of the same as may be required.

(2) The additional amount assessed under sub-section (1) of this section shall be paid, by the persons assessed, to the Mukhtar of the Village or group before the 31st day of July, 1942.

(3) Any amount appearing in the assessment list remaining unpaid after the 31st day of July, 1942, shall be collected and recovered in the same manner as Government taxes may be collected and recovered.

Application of sections 8 and 9 of the principal Law to assessment, etc. under this Law.

5. The provisions of sections 8 and 9 of the principal Law shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to the assessment made, and the collection and recovery of any amount assessed, under this Law.
