A LAW TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO CUSTOMS.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Law, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1942, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1944.

Amendment of the First Schedule to the principal Law.

2. Item No. 110 in the First Schedule to the principal Law (relating to tobacco) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of paragraphs (a) and (b) (relating to cigars and cigarettes and to manufactured tobacco, respectively) and the substitution therefor of the following paragraphs:—

(b) Manufactured .. per oke 1 18 1 2 1 1"
