THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 16 of 1945.

A LAW TO APPROPRIATE A SUM NOT EXCEEDING THREE MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN THOU-SAND, SEVEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE POUNDS TO THE SERVICE OF THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDING THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIVE.

Officer Administering the Government.

THEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such Preamble. expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1945, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, Short title. 1945.

Appropriation of £3,487,791.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated to the service of the King or which may be hereafter lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1945, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, any sum not exceeding the sum of Three Million, Four Hundred and Eighty-Seven Thousand, Seven Hundred and Ninety-One Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.

Limitation of sums to be spent.

3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each head in the Schedule hereto may be issued and spent in respect of the Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein.

Date of coming into operation.

4. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1945.

A Law to amend the Interest Law, 1944.

Officer Administering the Government.

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:-

1. This Law may be cited as the Interest (Amendment) Short title. Law, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Interest Law, 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal 37 of 1944 Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Interest Laws, 1944 and 1945.

2. Section 3 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and Repeal of the following section substituted therefor:-

" Arrears of interest not to exceed principal

debt.

3.—(1) The amount which may be recovered principal by action as arrears of interest on any debt or substitution obligation shall not exceed the amount of the of new principal debt or obligation in respect of which

such interest is payable.

(2) For the purposes of this section, any proceedings taken under the provisions of the Sale of Mortgaged Property Laws, 1890 and 1944, or any law amending or substituted for the same, shall be deemed to be an action."
