A LAW TO AMEND THE GOVERNMENT WATERWORKS
LAW, 1928.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Government Waterworks (Amendment) Law, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Government Waterworks Law, 1928, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Government Waterworks Laws, 1928 and 1945.

Short title.

2. Sub-section (1) of section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the proviso at the end thereof and the substitution therefor of the following proviso:—

Amendment of section 3 (1) of the principal Law.

"Provided that no permission under this sub-section shall be required in respect of any water from any well or line of wells sunk or constructed in virtue of a permit of the Commissioner issued under the provisions of the Wells Law, 1945."

3. This Law shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by notice in the *Gazette*.
