A LAW TO AMEND THE CYPRUS PENSIONS ORDERS
AND LAWS, 1929 TO 1944.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Cyprus Pensions Order in Council, 1929, (Amendment) Law, 1946, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus Pensions Orders and Laws, 1929 to 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), and the Order and this Law may together be cited as the Cyprus Pensions Orders and Laws, 1929 to 1946.

Repeal of section 3 of the Order and substitution of new section.

2. Section 3 of the Order is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

“Pension regulations.

3.—(1) Pensions, gratuities and other allowances may be granted by the Governor in Council in accordance with the regulations contained in the First Schedule to this Order to officers who have been in the service of Cyprus.

The said regulations may from time to time be amended, added to, or revoked by regulations made by the Governor in Council with the sanction of the Secretary of State, and all regulations so made shall be published in the *Gazette*.

Any pension or gratuity granted under this Order shall be computed in accordance with the provisions in force at the actual date of an officer's retirement.

(2) All regulations made under this section shall have the same force and effect as if they were contained in the First Schedule to this Order, and the expression ‘this Order’ shall, wherever it occurs in this Order, be construed as including a reference to the said Schedule.”

Amendment of section 7 of the Order.

3. Paragraph (c) of section 7 of the Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the word “and” (line 4) and the substitution therefor of the word “or”.
