THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 22 OF 1947.

A LAW TO EXTEND THE TIME FOR THE GIVING OF A NOTICE UNDER SECTION 72 OF THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION LAWS, 1933 TO 1947.

WHEREAS by section 72 of the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to 1947, it is provided that the Director shall, by the fifteenth day of October in each year, cause to be delivered to the Chairman of each Town Committee or Village Commission for Greek-Orthodox schools a notice calling upon the Committee or Commission to assess certain amounts and fees required for certain purposes under the said Laws :

AND WHEREAS the Director has failed to cause a notice as aforesaid in respect of the school year commencing on the first day of September, 1947, to be delivered as aforesaid by the fifteenth day of October, 1947, to the Chairman of the Town Committee for Greek-Orthodox schools in the town of Limassol :

AND WHEREAS it is expedient in the interests of elementary education in the Colony that such amounts and fees should be assessed as aforesaid in respect of the school year as aforesaid :

BE it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

Power to

1. This Law may be cited as the Elementary Education Assessment Notice (Limassol Town) Law, 1947, and shall be read in conjunction with the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to 1947, (hereinafter referred to as "the Laws"), and words in this Law shall have the same meaning as words in the Laws.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Laws, a notice under section 72 of the Laws in respect of the school year commencing on the first day of September, 1947, may be delivered by the Director by the thirtieth November, 1947, and every such notice so delivered shall be valid and effective for all purposes of the Laws and the provision of the Laws, subsequent to the delivery of a notice under section 72 thereof, shall be complied with as therein provided.
