## THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

## No. 29 of 1948.

A LAW TO REMOVE DOUBTS WITH REGARD TO PERSONS DETAINED UNDER THE DETENTION (ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS) LAWS, 1946 AND 1948.

WHEREAS it is desirable that the matter of the detention of persons detained under the Detention (Illegal Immigrants) Laws, 1946 and 1948, should be placed beyond doubt:

BE it, therefore, enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Illegal Immigrants, short title. Detention (Removal of Doubts) Law, 1948, and shall be read in conjunction with the Detention (Illegal Immigrants) Laws, 1946 and 1948, (hereinafter referred to as "the <sup>15</sup> of <sup>1946</sup> principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law <sup>4</sup> of <sup>1948</sup> shall be construed as one.

Removal of doubts with regard to persons detained under principal Law. 2. For the removal of doubts it is hereby declared that every person who has been detained in a place established for the detention of persons under the principal Law, has been lawfully detained under the provisions of that Law, and any person detained in any such place at the commencement of this Law is lawfully detained under the principal Law:

Provided that this section shall not affect the determination of any legal proceedings instituted before the commencement of this Law.
