## A LAW TO AMEND THE CORPORATE BODIES (IMMOVABLE PROPERTY REGISTRATION) LAWS, 1908 AND 1931.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Corporate Bodies (Immovable Property Registration) (Amendment) Law, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Corporate Bodies (Immovable Property Registration) Laws, 1908 and 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Corporate Bodies (Immovable Property Registration) Laws, 1908 to 1948.

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion in the definition of the term "Corporate Body", immediately after paragraph (e), of the following paragraph :—

"(f) The government of any foreign Power declared by the Governor to be a corporate body for the purposes of this Law."

3. Section 7 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after paragraph (c) of the following paragraph (the full stop at the end of the said paragraph being substituted by a semicolon) :—

"(d) In the case of a government of a foreign Power the consul, consular officer or other representative in the Colony of such government."

4. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 11, of the following section :—

"Certain sections of the Law not to apply to foreign governments."

11A. Sections 4, 5, 6 and 10 of the principal Law shall not apply to any application for registration or to any immovable property registered in the name of the government of any foreign Power declared by the Governor to be a corporate body for the purposes of this Law."
