**THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS**

**No. 23 OF 1949.**

A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR CERTAIN OFFENCES AND THE IMPOSITION AND RECOVERY OF FEES IN CONNECTION WITH THE REGISTRATION OF CITIZENSHIP AND THE GRANT OF CERTIFICATES OF NATURALIZATION UNDER THE BRITISH NATIONALITY ACT, 1948.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the British Nationality Short title. (Offences and Fees) Law, 1949, and shall be read in conjunction with the British Nationality Act, 1948.

Offences.

2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires—  
“Act” means the British Nationality Act, 1948, or  
any other Act amending or substituted for the same.

3.—(1) Any person who for the purpose of procuring anything to be done or not to be done under the Act makes any statement which he knows to be false in a material particular, or recklessly makes any statement which is false in a material particular, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with any requirement imposed on him by regulations made under the Act with respect to the delivering up of certificates of naturalization shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

Regulations.

4. The Governor may by regulations make provision for the imposition and recovery of fees in respect of any application made to the Governor under the Act or in respect of any registration, or the making of any declaration, or the grant of any certificate, or the taking of any oath of allegiance, authorized to be made, granted or taken by or under the Act, and in respect of supplying a certified or other copy of any notice, certificate, order, declaration or entry, given, granted or made as aforesaid and for the application of any such fees.

5. The British Nationality and Status of Aliens (Fees) Law, 1924, is hereby repealed.
