THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 9 OF 1950.

A LAW TO AMEND THE CERTIFYING OFFICERS LAW, 1888.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Certifying Officers (Amendment) Law, 1950, and shall be read as one with the Certifying Officers Law, 1888, (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Certifying Officers Laws, 1888 and 1950.

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after the words “One to each District Commissioner;” (line 7) of the words “one to the Colonial Secretary;”

“Fee.

8. A fee not exceeding two shillings shall be payable to a certifying officer in respect of every signature or seal certified by him under the provisions of this Law.”
