# THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 15 of 1951.

A Law to appropriate a sum not exceeding Four Million, Six Hundred and Five Thousand, Seven Hundred and Forty-Seven Pounds to the Service of the Twelve Months ending the Thirty-First Day of December, in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-One.

WHEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such Preamble. expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1951, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, Short title. 1951.

Appropriation of £4,605,747.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated to the service of the King or which may be hereafter lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1951, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, any sum not exceeding the sum of Four Million, Six Hundred and Five Thousand, Seven Hundred and Forty-Seven Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.

Limitation of sums to be spent.

3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each head in the Schedule hereto may be issued and spent in respect of the Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein.

Date of coming into operation.

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4. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1951.

A Law to declare the Terms and Conditions applicable to Loans authorized to be raised by the Government of Cyprus and to provide for the creation of Cyprus Stock.

WHEREAS it is expedient to define in one Law the terms and conditions applicable to loans hereinafter authorized to be raised by the Government of Cyprus and whereas it is expedient to provide for the creation of Cyprus stock and to enable the said Government to take advantage of the provisions of the Acts of the Imperial Parliament entitled the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1948, and any Act amending the same:

BE it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the General Loan and short title. Stock Law, 1951.
