## THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 27 of 1951.

A Law to amend the Motor Car Law.

CAP. 125

I. FLETCHER-COOKE,

Officer Administering the Government.

E it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

I. This Law may be cited as the Motor Car (Amendment) Short title. Law, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Motor Car Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

2. Section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended by Amendment the insertion therein of the following sub-section:

- "(3) The Governor in Council may, by order published principal in the Gazette, increase all or any of the fees as set out in the First, Second and Third Schedules hereto by an amount not exceeding fifty per centum."
- 3. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion Insertion therein, immediately after section 5, of the following section:— of new section 5A "Concurrent 5A. Where with the consent of the owner in the liability of (whether express or implied) any motor car is principal Law. owner of used or is operated in such manner that its use

or operation constitutes an offence against any

Regulations made under this Law, the owner of such motor car shall be deemed to be a party to the commission of such offence and may be charged and tried with actually committing the offence and may be punished accordingly, unless he establishes to the satisfaction of the court that the offence was committed without his knowledge and was not due to any act or omission on his part."

Deletion of the First Schedule to the principal Law and substitution of new Schedule.

4. The principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the First Schedule thereto and the substitution therefor of the following First Schedule:—
