DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :-

1. This Law may be cited as the Motor Car (Amendment) Short title. Law, 1953, and shall be read as one with the Motor Car Cap. 125. Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

"(f) the regulation and control of traffic, the prescribing of the conduct of drivers of motor cars and carriages in the interest of the safety and convenience of the public and for the prevention of injury or damage to persons, animals or other property and the requiring of motor cars and carriages to be constructed or provided with such fittings accessories as may be prescribed;".

3. The Motor Car Regulations, 1951, until varied or Motor Car revoked by any Regulations made under section 4 of the Regulations, 1951, deemed principal Law, shall be deemed to have been made and shall to have been have effect as if made under the provisions of the principal Law, as amended by this Law.
