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# THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

## No. 19 OF 1954.

A LAW TO AMEND THE INTERPRETATION LAW.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Interpretation (Amendment) Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Interpretation Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Law.

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, in its proper alphabetical place, of the following definition:—

“ ‘Member’ means any ex officio member of the Executive Council of the Colony, that is to say, the Colonial Secretary, the Attorney-General or the Financial Secretary ; ”.

Repeal of section 23 of the principal Law and substitution of new section.

3. Section 23 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“Signification of orders, etc., of the Governor.

23. Where any Law confers upon the Governor power to make any public instrument or appointment, give any directions, issue any order, authorize any thing or matter to be done, grant any exemption, remit any fee or penalty or exercise any other power, it shall be sufficient if the exercise of such power by the Governor be signified under the hand of a Member :

Provided that any warrant, proclamation, or other instrument under the public seal of the Colony shall be signed by the Governor in person.”.
