**THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS**

**No. 24 OF 1954.**

**A LAW TO AMEND THE CIVIL PROCEDURE LAW.**

**CAP. 7.**

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

**1.** This Law may be cited as the Civil Procedure (Amendment) Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Civil Procedure Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"). Short title.

2. Section 13 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following sub-sections (the existing part thereof being numbered as sub-section (1)) :—

“(2) Any judgment or order of a Court for the recovery or delivery of possession of any immovable property may be enforced by a writ of possession directing the Sheriff or other officer to put the judgment creditor in possession of that property.

(3) Any judgment or order of a Court for the recovery or delivery of any movable property may be enforced by a writ of delivery directing the Sheriff or other officer to take such movable property and deliver it to the judgment creditor.

(4) Rules of Court, made by the Governor with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice, may prescribe the form of a writ of possession and of a writ of delivery and the fees to be paid in connection therewith and regulate the procedure for the issue and execution of such writs.”

3. Paragraph (c) of section 15 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the substitution for the words “ten pounds” (line 4) of the words “fifty pounds”.

4. Section 95 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the substitution for the words “Judge of the Mahkémé-i-Sheri” (lines 1 and 2) of the words “Judge of a Turkish Family Court”.

5. Section 97 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

“Saving.

97. Nothing in this Law shall be held to annul or abridge the right of any Court to enforce obedience to any order issued by it under the provisions of the Courts of Justice Law, 1953.”

6. Sections 93, 94 and 96 of the principal Law are hereby repealed.
