A LAW TO AMEND THE IMMOVABLE PROPERTY TAX LAW. CAP. 296.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Immovable Property Tax (Amendment) Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Immovable Property Tax Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

Short title.

Cap. 296.

2. Section 8 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after paragraph (f), of the following paragraph (the full stop at the end thereof being substituted by a semi-colon) :—

Amendment of section 8 of the principal Law.

"(g) on any immovable property used or occupied exclusively for the purposes of any charitable institution of a public character supported mainly by endowments or voluntary contributions in so far as such immovable property is held for such purposes."

A LAW TO AMEND THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAW. CAP. 252

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Municipal Corporations (Amendment) Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporations Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

Amendment of section 92 of the principal Law.

2. Paragraph (d) of sub-section (4) of section 92 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after sub-paragraph (ii) of the following sub-paragraph :—

“(iii) used or occupied exclusively for the purposes of any charitable institution of a public character supported mainly by endowments or voluntary contributions in so far as such immovable property is held for such purposes;”.
