r. This Law may be cited as the Passports (False Representations) (Amendment) Law, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Passports (False Representations) Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Law. 2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the substitution for the words "to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding six months, or to both such penalties" (lines 4 and 5) of the words "to imprisonment not exceeding one year or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine".
