A LAW TO AMEND THE POLICE LAW.

Governor.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Police (Amendment) Law, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Police Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 25, of the following new section :—

“Power to
Com-
missioner to
prohibit
or restrict
traffic in
certain cases.

25A.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in this or any other Law contained, the Commissioner may, in exceptional cases when in his opinion the public interest so requires, make an order, to be published in the *Gazette*, prohibiting or restricting, either generally or during particular hours, within any specified area or on any specified road, such kind of traffic, other than pedestrian, as may be specified in the order.

(2) Any order made under sub-section (1) shall remain in force for such period, not exceeding one month, as may be specified therein, unless in the meantime the order is confirmed by the Governor-in-Council ; and such order may at any time be annulled or amended by the Governor-in-Council.

(3) Any person who uses a vehicle, or causes or permits a vehicle to be used, or does any other act, in contravention of an order made under this section shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine”.

3. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 38, of the following new section :—

“Pensions
and
gratuities.

38A.—(1) It shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council to grant a pension, gratuity or allowance of such an amount and under such terms and conditions as the Governor-in-Council may determine—

(a) to any special constable, appointed under this Law, who has received any injury whilst in the execution of his duty ;

(b) to any of the legal personal representatives of such special constable who has died as the direct result of an injury received whilst in the execution of his duty.

(2) For the purposes of this section the Civil Defence Organisation (Emergency Provisions) Law shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to this section as if that Law applied to special constables appointed under this Law”.
