A LAW TO AMEND THE PENSIONS LAW.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Pensions Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

2. Paragraph (a) of the definition of "pensionable emoluments", contained in sub-section (1) of section 2 of the principal Law, is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

"(a) in respect of service in Cyprus includes salary, personal allowance, overseas allowance, good conduct pay and merit allowance, but does not include duty allowance, entertainment allowance or any other emoluments whatever ;".

3. Section 6A of the principal Law (as set out in section 3 of the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1952) is hereby repealed.

4. Section 8 of the principal Law is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the insertion in the proviso to sub-section (1) thereof, immediately after paragraph (b), of the following paragraph (the full stop at the end of the said paragraph (b) being substituted by a semi-colon) :—

"(c) an officer who attains the age of compulsory retirement on any day other than the last day of a month shall continue in the public service up to and including the last day of the month in which he attains the said age and any pension for which he may be eligible shall be payable as from the first day of the succeeding month." ;

(b) by the deletion from paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) thereof (as amended by paragraph (b) of section 4 of the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1952) of the words " seven hundred and fifty pounds " (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the words " one thousand pounds ".
