A LAW TO AMEND THE ADVOCATES' CLERKS LAW.

CAP. 4.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Advocates' Clerks (Amendment) Law, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Advocates' Clerks Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after section 5, of the following new section :—

"Educational
qualification
of clerks.

5A.—(1) The Registrar shall not register any person as a clerk under this Law unless such person satisfies the Registrar that he has received education in a secondary school for a period of not less than two years.

(2) Nothing in this section contained shall apply to any person who is registered as a clerk under this Law on the date on which this section comes into operation."
