A LAW TO GRANT DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES
TO MEMBERS OF THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION
OF HUMAN RIGHTS.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering
the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the
Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities (European Commission of Human Rights) Law, 1958. Short title.

2. Members of the European Commission of Human Rights, and their official staffs accompanying them as members, shall enjoy— Privileges and immunities of members of European Commission of Human Rights.

(a) while exercising their functions as such, and during their journeys to and from the place of meeting, immunity from personal arrest or detention and from seizure of their personal baggage and inviolability for all papers and documents ;

(b) immunity from legal process of every kind in respect of words spoken or written and all acts done by them in their capacity as members.
