

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated for the service of the Queen or which may be lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1958, out of the revenue and moneys payable to any sum not exceeding the sum of Twenty Millions, Four Hundred and Ninety-One Thousand One Hundred and Thirty-Four Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for each period as set out in columns (3) and (4) of the Schedule and there shall be issued also and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1958, out of the Government Fund of the Colony any sum not exceeding the sum of Four Millions, Eighty-Six Thousand and Fifty-Three Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for each period as set out in columns (3) and (4) of the Schedule.

3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each heading in the Schedule may be raised and spent in respect of any Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein.

4. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1956.

A LAW TO AMEND THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' PENSIONS LAW.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1958, and shall be read as one with the Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

2.—(1) Paragraph (d) of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the substitution for the word "three" (line 2) of the word "five".
