Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Public Bodies and Public Offices (Appointments) Law.

Interpreta-  
tion.

2. In this Law—

“public body” means any Board, Commission, Committee or Council—

- (a) established by or under any Law; or
- (b) which has power to act under and for the purposes of any Law ;

“public office” means any office—

- (a) the power of appointing or nominating a person to which ; or
- (b) the power of approving the appointment or nomination of a person to which ;

is vested in the Governor or in any public officer or in any public body.

3. Where by or under any Law, public instrument or other lawful authority—

- (a) the Governor or any public authority is empowered to appoint or nominate persons to serve as officers or members on any public body ; or
- (b) the Governor or any public officer or any public body is empowered—
  - (i) to appoint or nominate a person to any public office ; or

(ii) to approve the appointment or nomination of a person to any public office, ~~and~~

such power of appointment, nomination or approval as aforesaid shall be exercisable by the Governor, public authority, public officer or public body, as the case may be, only in respect of persons who are British subjects.
